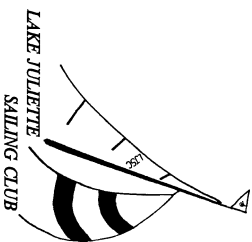

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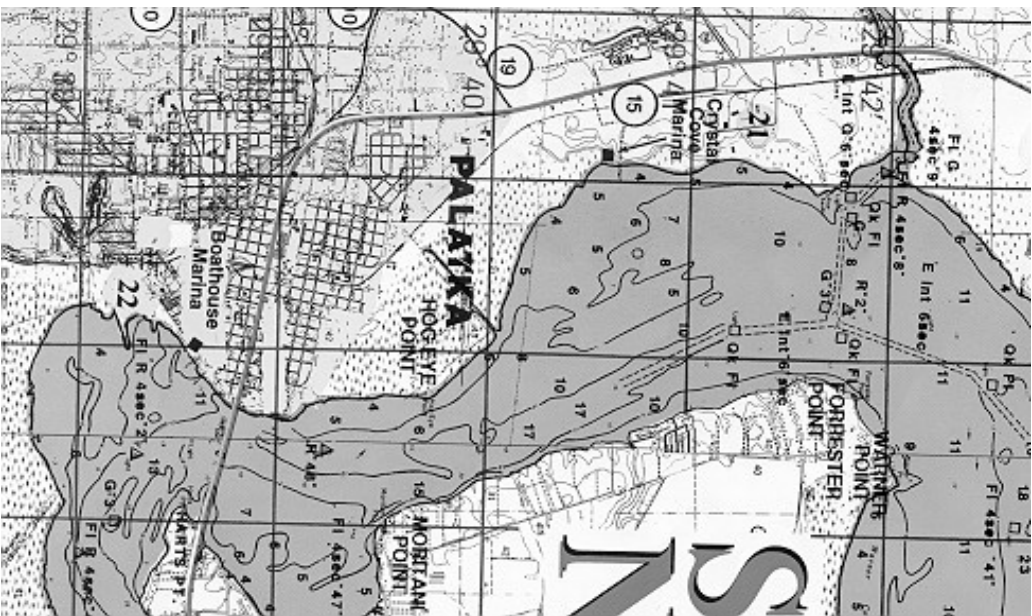

Each of these boats must have more than 50% of their crew between 15 and 25yrs old. They will cruise the East Coast for about a month, then they will race from Boston to Halifax Nova Scotia. Joining up there with the Op Sail 2000 ships, they will all race to Amsterdam, Holland, arriving sometime around Aug. 24<sup>th</sup>. Once again the East Coast will see tall ships sailing. Two different organizations, Operation Sail 2000 and Tall Ships 2000 are involved in bringing these majestic sailing vessels from all over the world to help celebrate our national birthday and the beginning of the new Century.

The centerpiece of Operation Sail 2000 is the Fourth of July celebration on the Hudson River. More than 30 Class A Tall ships along with 375 smaller vessels will take part in a 'Parade of Sail'. Both before and after, this fleet will visit 7 other ports along the East Coast. See schedule following text.

## Memorial Weekend Cruise 2000

This year the Club is again sailing on the St John's River. The expected turnout for this cruise will be about 10 boats. Last year about half of the Club members that went down there for the weekend, put in at Green Cove Springs. The sail South to Palatka and then back was quite a trip. This year the plan is to put in at either the Palatka Public Boat launch ramp (which will be hard to get to because of the festival that will be going on) or to put in at Crystal Cove Marina, which is about 2-3 miles North of Palatka (down river) off highway 17. The Crystal Cove Marina has good water depth and will be the best choice. A number of members launched there last year with very good reviews.



The route to launch for most of us will be to come down either I-95 or across on I 10 and turn south on I-295. While on I-295 look for the Orange Park exit, highway 17 South, located just before the bridge over the St. John's River. After turning south on Highway 17, drive about 35-45 miles. After going over the Rice Creek Bridge look for Crystal Cove Marina to be on your left. If you come across the intersection of Highway 19 you have gone too far South. See the circled #15 on the map on the cover of this newsletter. See tide chart for launching times on the next page of this newsletter.

Some of the Club members (The Racers) will be expecting to race in the Blue Crab Festival Regatta. They will probably stay in the Palatka area racing each day and spending the evenings enjoying the festival. Some of the Club members (The Cruisers) intend to sail south heading toward Lake George or Crescent Lake depending on bridge heights and water depths. Lake George appears to be about 40 miles South and Crescent Lake looks to be about 10 miles Southeast. Since Fred will not be with us on this trip we will need to talk with the local Sailing Club to get more details about what lies to the South and if it is 'sailable'
