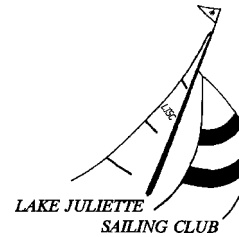

Racing News

As you may know Lake Juliette Sailing Club did not have any scheduled races in the month of December. This did not stop some of our own members from seeking out a challenge. The city of Sebastian Florida held its annual S.L.O.B.'s Fest Regatta on Lake Monroe, including two days of open Portsmouth class racing, in winds of 6-11 knots.



Ashley Saylor, 13 years old, sailing her "Raider Sport" with crew (her mother Laurie on day one, and Paul Keller on day two) went on to place third against stiff competitors including Josh Putnam, (present JY 15 national champion) placing first and Yevgeniy Burmatnov, (Olympic champion) placing second.

Carl Saylor, sailing his "Tanzer 22" with crew (Ron Katz on day one, and adding his wife Laurie on day two) took three firsts and a second to finish first over all in the Portsmouth non-spinnaker class.

There was a total of 43 boats, including two trimarans in the line up on 3 different courses. The weather was warm and sunny on Saturday, and cold and cloudy Sunday. All in all it was a exciting time with pizza, drinks, and stories flowing freely. The launch facilities were good, though crowded, and the water on the lake was very low making launching and retrieval of a keel boat difficult.

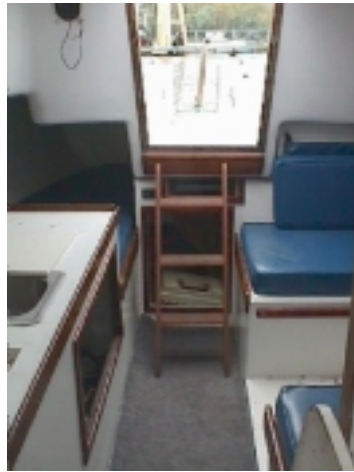
