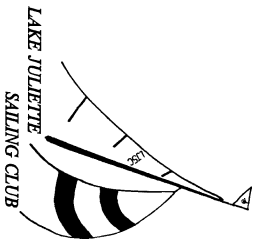

Sinclair Regatta 22-23 May

With a nice West wind, we started. Carl was just off the starting pin in perfect position, sailing a port tack and on an easy reach for the channel. Everyone had up their 150 jibs because the wind was not too strong and the wind was abeam or off the port quarter. Not 300 yards up the course the wind shifted and now it was close hauled sailing and guess what, I did not need to be closehauled singlehanded trying to be competitive, with my 150 up. Mike Bragg got a late start and was 5 to 10 minutes behind but for some reason he sailed by me as if he was skating on ice. T Ron Katz on Sea Witch, Dick Mueller on his O'Day 22 and myself on my MacGregor 25 battled to keep ahead of each other all the way up the lake. I was able to stay ahead of Dick Mueller but he won on corrected time.

The sail back proved interesting for many of us as each would sail into some dead air and watch others sail by wondering where they were getting the wind. Rene Ducheneau on his thistle thought he was doing alright but without using a spinnaker and with an 83 handicap, his finish position was only 9th. The return trip was a very challenging trip for all the racers.

Sunday morning came in very calm. By race time though, the wind had picked up a lot and was enough to provide Ron Katz with a broken rudder, even before the starting gun for the first race. With the wind building, the racing was very hot. Carl Saylor, on his Tanzer 22 was testing his windows/fishviewing ports for leaks. Boston had up his big blue jib for the first race but it proved to be too much so he put up his 110 but it got tangled and he came in only to find that he would have to lower his mast to get it undone. Steve Rummage came thru once again to take the honors of first for the regatta, with Carl Saylor close behind with a 2nd.
